## Registration Deadline: MAY 21<sup>st</sup>

Registrations will be accepted in order of receipt. You are encouraged to pre-register so that you can receive up-to-the-minute information and save time and money! A confirmation letter will be mailed in early June with directions to Wolfeboro. No refunds will be issued after May 21<sup>st</sup>. All participants (clergy, lay, visitor, and exhibitors) pay a registration fee. A late payment fee of \$30 will be assessed to all those who register after May 21<sup>st</sup> including “walk-ins.”

## CERTIFICATION of DELEGATES

If you are an elected voting delegate, you must have the clerk or pastor of your church sign your registration form certifying your status. Clergy delegates, as well as Conference leaders who are not delegates from their local church, will be certified by the Conference office.

## HOUSING and MEALS

On-campus housing at Brewster Academy is available for delegates and visitors. Most dormitory rooms are double occupancy, with a shared bathroom in the hallway. There are limited triple, quad and single rooms also available. For dormitories with mixed genders, one bathroom on each floor will be designated for either male or female use. Most dormitories have two or three floors. Please indicate your preferred roommate on your on-campus housing questionnaire. If you do not have a roommate, one will be assigned to you. Cost includes breakfast Saturday morning, but does NOT include linens; please remember to bring your own sheets & towels. Housing is limited – so register early!

For commuters and overnight guests three meals will be available: Friday lunch and dinner & Saturday lunch. Served buffet style, multiple entrees and beverages including vegetarian options, will be offered.
