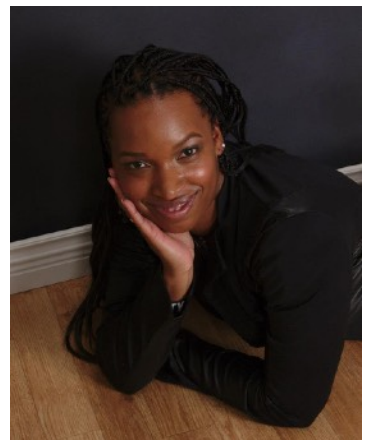

Wednesday Workshops

Wednesday Morning Workshops

W-1: Raising Prophets: Forming Youth in Justice and Advocacy Work, Jessica Moore

Children and youth are naturally inclined toward justice. How many of us have heard a young person say "That's not fair!!"? And, while they may ask that question in a personal way; how can we help youth channel this energy out into the world? How can we encourage them to lean on their faith as they navigate the tumultuous world of social action? Join us in the discussion and sharing of ways to form inspiring and involved youth in the world now!

W-2: Terrariums, Plant & Pray, Kristin Putney

In this workshop, experience meditation and pray as each participant builds a spiritual terrarium filled with meaning and purpose. All materials will be provided. Plant. Pray. Now. Maximum of 15 participants

W-3: Special Needs Students Invited in the Neurotypical Classroom, What now?, Roxanne French

A whole group interactive participation of real tools that can be used instead of traditional curriculum. This workshop will include meditation, Godly Play lesson with response in Play Doh and watercolors, Praying in Color, and a discussion around the possibility of inclusive Confirmation and what lessons would look like. No artistic talent required, no judgment.

W-4: Choosing and Adapting Curriculum & Resources, Debbie Gline Allen

Do the curriculum materials used in your Faith Formation programs tend to fall short of your expectations? That's because the publisher does not know your congregation like you do. This workshop will provide guidance in evaluating, selecting, and adapting Faith Formation curriculum materials to meet the needs of your particular congregation.

W-5: Nurturing Safe Ministry Environments- Your Call to Lead, Karen Ziel

Actively engaged in mission and ministries of all types, we must model the highest standards of practice possible in order to establish and maintain safe and hospitable communities. This workshop will train leaders in practices designed to maintain safe spaces in most aspects of congregational life. Content will include how to create a training, healthy relationships with vulnerable populations, safer communications standards, making safe accommodations to policy standards, resources.

W-6: Household Huddle: A New Way to Experience Faith Together, Kelly Thibeault

Are you finding it difficult to get enough teachers? Are you aggravated by inconsistent Sunday School attendance? Do you wish there was a way to teach families to experience real faith together? Household Huddle is a new Faith Formation model that the First Congregational Church in North Attleboro has been using for the past year. Household Huddle offers a simple guideline to help individuals and groups alike to experience their faith in new ways.

W-6: Household Huddle: A New Way to Experience Faith Together, Kelly Thibeault (Cont.)

Household Huddle can be experienced with a church family on Sunday mornings, and by individual families in the car, around the dinner table or at bed time during the week. It encourages the practice of faith as not just a Sunday morning thing, but a real way of living. It encourages all ages and stages to work together, everyone becomes a teacher and a learner at the same time.

DIY Faith: Ministry Leader Edition, Traci Smith

Learn how to help families practice faith at home: DIY style! By the end of this breakout session you will have created a 90 minute workshop to present to families that is loaded with easy to implement, meaningful practices. Wednesday Afternoon Flex-Time Workshops

WA-1: Christ Walk: A Spiritual Fitness Practice, Dawne Quinn

There is a reason God gave us feet! We have feet to walk, run, jump and skip through our lives. Join us for a brisk walk around Swanzey Lake. Come and learn about this 40-day spiritual fitness program based on the book, Christ Walk by Anna Fitch Courie. We'll begin and end our walk with a Bible verse related to reflective pieces on healthy living. Wear comfortable walking shoes.

WA-2: Create Your Own Nurturing Vessel, Stacy Inman

Find your creative side and join me to embellish your own watering can! Using various techniques such as decoupage, stenciling and stamping, create a unique watering can to use in nurturing your plants this spring. No prior decorating skills needed! (This workshop carries an additional fee of \$10.00 to be collected at workshop)

WA-3: Walk the Labyrinth, Self Guided

As a meditation tool consisting of a walkable single line path, a labyrinth can be a source of solace and can quiet a distracted or overactive mind. When troubled by disturbing emotions or unfortunate events in your life, walking a labyrinth can help resolve your inner discomfort and still your mind enough for you to get clarity of what is going on. As a spiritual tool, both the calming and quieting effect and the metaphorical symbolism of the labyrinth as a pathway on a journey or a spiritual track can help you to ponder life's greater mysteries.

Thursday Workshops

TH-1: How to Grow a Youth Group, Sheri Anderson

These are challenging times for those engaged in Youth Ministry but youth groups, alongside other forms of ministry, are still helpful and relevant to today's youth. Learn some practical ways to recruit, engage and empower youth in youth group settings. This workshop focuses on time tested principles not trendy gimmicks. Lots of program ideas and resources will be shared.

TH-2: Encounter with Scriptures: Lectio Divina, Marilyn Kendrix

Lectio divina is an ancient practice of praying the scriptures. During lectio divina, we listen to the text of the Bible with the "ear of the heart," as if in conversation with God, and God is suggesting the topics for discussion. The method of lectio divina includes reading (lectio), reflecting on (meditation), responding to (oratio) and resting in (contemplation) the scriptures with the aim of nourishing and deepening one's relationship with the Divine. Experience scripture in a different way using this ancient practice.

TH-3: Mental Health: Replacing Myths with Facts that Nurture and Empower our Youth, Peggy Matteson

1 in 5 teens and young adults live with a mental health condition – half develop the condition by age 14. Experiencing signs of mental illness can be scary and confusing. Many youth first reveal their concerns to a trusted church leader. The basic signs of common brain diseases and how to respond most effectively to individuals will be discussed. Stories of programming activities that increase understanding about mental health issues and a variety of resources will be shared to assist you and your colleagues.

TH-4: UCC 101, Debi Mastroni-Kenyon and Rev. Nick Davis

Have you ever wanted to learn about the exciting history of the United Church of Christ, but don't want to have to take a formal class to do so? Then this workshop is for you. We will explore the rich history of the UCC and many of its social justice works. We will also discuss the current Purpose, Vision, and Mission of the UCC – better known as "The 3 Great Loves".

TH-5: Faith Formation Leadership: Challenges and Innovations, Rev. Traci Smith

What challenge are you facing right now in ministry? Whether it's recruiting (or retaining) volunteers, dealing with unsupportive leadership, or a personal challenge of a different kind, this workshop is for you. We'll take some time talking about our various challenges and finding solutions together. We'll talk about what it means to be an innovative leader in a changing landscape for Faith Formation.

TH-6: Singing the Bible in Worship and Faith Formation, Ruth Shaver

Most of us probably know at least a few Bible stories and memory verses because of children's songs learned from teachers, parents, and grandparents. Our hymnody and contemporary music teach Biblical stories and themes, as well. In this workshop, we will look at favorite hymns and other worship songs, Biblical stories, and Biblical themes for deepening our understanding of our faith.
